Where's my home?

The tension in life of the second generation and where they can find inner strength and peace.

In June 2019, the monthly one-day seminar of the Integration Accompanier Training in Aarau dealt with the topic "Secondos". It was designed by the MEOS staff members Barbara and Johannes Müller (African Link). This training helps people who want to establish contacts with migrants to cultivate or develop sensitivity for other cultures.

Intern Susanna Pope, who herself grew up in three countries, describes her impressions of the topic of this day seminar.

Understanding migrant children better

Sensitivity is very important, especially for migrant children, because they get the feeling from everywhere that they don't belong. A young woman with Tamil roots, who grew up in Switzerland (and speaks Swiss German), is addressed on the street in High German. A teenager of Croatian origin is denied access to discotheques - only because of his foreign-sounding name.

But many migrant children are also not at home in the culture of their parents. They think and act differently because they are shaped by Switzerland. A Tamil father put it this way: "Our children are coconut children - brown on the outside, white on the inside".

Between two worlds

This is how a young person with African roots feels: "In Switzerland I am the African. But in Africa I am Swiss. Wherever I go, I do not fully belong there." At home he speaks Lingala and can eat very skillfully with his hands. He speaks perfect Swiss German on the streets and is ashamed when his mother carries

her shopping home on her head. He is at home in both worlds, but also feels strange in both.

At home in God

So where's home? Jesus also struggled with this question. He said of himself that he was homeless: "The foxes have their burrow and the birds their nests; but the Son of Man has no place to rest" (Matthew 8:20). Still in the same chapter, only a few verses after this statement, we find Jesus in the middle of the lake: "Suddenly a mighty storm broke loose, so that the waves crashed over the boat" (verse 24). And what did Jesus do? He slept. Jesus had no place to rest. And yet he came to rest everywhere. His secret? He had his home in God.

Zürich for meetings. MEOS needs a headquarter and offices, in order to meet. It is also very important to director Niklaus Meier that all offices are on the same floor, as this promotes a close, profitable co-operation. "Especially with such an international and often scattered team, this visible proximity to each other is very important. This strengthens the people and their service!
